What are the objectives of the award?

▶ The Prize aims to recognize outstanding research that enables policy makers, business leaders, and others to identify and implement measures to improve women's health in APEC economies so women can join and rise in the workforce. The Prize is now accepting applications from individuals who have conducted outstanding research work within five areas: workplace health and safety; health access and awareness; sexual and reproductive health; gender-based violence; and work life balance.
